This is a list of bird species known to occur in the region and their expected frequency of occurrence in each season *in their preferred habitat*. Hypothetical or exotic species are not included.

The region covered by this checklist includes south-central Matanuska-Susitna Borough, Alaska. The covered area does not extend south of Point Mackenzie, north or west of Petersville or east of Eureka, and it does not extend beyond borough borders. The region includes coastal, birch/spruce forest, lake/stream, wetland, taiga, and alpine tundra habitats. *A Birder's Guide to Alaska* by George West is highly recommended for anyone interested in birding Alaska.

Legend

- **A** Abundant. Species occurs repeatedly in proper habitats with available habitat heavily utilized. The area may regularly host great numbers of the species.
- C Common. Species occurs in all or nearly all proper habitats but some areas of presumed suitable habitat are occupied sparsely or not at all. The area may regularly host large numbers of the species.
- **U** Uncommon. Species occurs regularly but utilizes very little of the suitable habitat. The species is not observed regularly even in proper habitats.
- **R** Rare. Species occurs, or probably occurs, regularly within the region but in very small numbers.
- **Ca** Casual. Species has been recorded no more than a few times but irregular observations are likely over a period of years.
- **Ac** Accidental. Species has been recorded only a time or two and is so far from its usual range that further observations are unlikely.
