## 42<sup>nd</sup> Matanuska Valley (AKMV) Audubon Christmas Bird Count (CBC) Results

The 42<sup>nd</sup> Matanuska Valley Audubon Christmas Bird Count (CBC) took place on Count Day, Sunday, December 19, 2021. During the CBC, Field Teams, and Feeder Counters at home, counted all of the birds that they saw within the Matanuska Valley CBC Count Circle, a 15 mile diameter circle centered on the old Four Corners intersection of Old Trunk Road/Stringfield Road and the Palmer-Wasilla Highway.

Twenty-nine Field Counters and 10 Feeder Counters (3 of whom were also Field Counters) participated in this year's Count. Temperatures were mostly in the teens for the majority of the day, and ranged from about 14° to 19° with mostly partly cloudy skies. The winds were calm throughout the circle. Most waterbodies were frozen but there was some open water at the Palmer Wastewater Treatment Plant and at streams such as the Cottonwood Creek outflow from Wasilla Lake and below the Creekside Shopping area, and some parts of Spring Creek in the Old Matanuska Townsite area.

Counts for almost all species were down and appeared to be a reflection of what most birders in south-central Alaska have been seeing this winter at their bird feeders. The crazy weather patterns seem to have really affected the way that most species move through our area. Despite the generally low species' counts, two new species were observed, a Pintail and Gadwall at the Palmer Wastewater Treatment Plant. Other rare or unusual sightings included a Northern Sawwhet Owl, Northern Flicker and Lincoln's sparrow, all seen at the same feeder in Wasilla. Some of these counts are subject to further approval by regional or national Audubon Christmas Bird Count editors.

Thanks to all of our Field Counters and Feeder Counters for helping with this year's Christmas Bird Count!
